A BILL ENTITLED

AN ACT concerning

Employees' Retirement System - Line of Duty Death Benefit - Children

FOR the purpose of providing that a line of duty death benefit will be paid to, or for the benefit of, a child who attends a certain school under certain conditions after reaching the age of 18; and generally relating to the expansion of the line of duty death benefit for certain children of deceased members of the retirement system.

By repealing and reenacting, with amendments

Section 5-1-228(a)(2) Article 5. Pensions and Retirement Baltimore County Code, 2003

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE
- 2 COUNTY, MARYLAND, that the Laws of Baltimore County shall read as follows:

If there be no surviving spouse or child under the age of eighteen (18) years surviving such deceased member, then to the member's dependent father or dependent mother, as the deceased member shall have nominated by written designation, duly acknowledged and filed with the Board of Trustees, or if there be no such nomination then to the member's dependent father or dependent mother as the Board of Trustees in its discretion shall direct, to continue for life.

20 21 22 23	SECTION 2. AND BE IT ENACTED, that this Act shall apply to the child of a deceased member of the retirement system for whom a benefit is payable under § 5-1-228(a)(2) of the Baltimore County Code, 2003 if the child is under 18 years of age on or before the effective date of this Act.
24 25	SECTION 3. AND BE IT ENACTED, that this Act, having passed by the affirmative vote of five members of the County Council, shall effect on December 15, 2013.
