AN ACT concerning

The 2013-2014 Current Expense Budget General Fund Department of Public Works

FOR the purpose of amending the 2013-2014 Current Expense Budget, by appropriating to the General Fund monies derived from unreserved, undersigned General Fund Surplus as of June 30, 2013.

WHEREAS, in accordance with Section 712 of the Baltimore County Charter, the County Council may make supplementary appropriations from unexpended and unencumbered funds set aside for the contingencies in the county budget; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Public Works Storm Emergencies Program has experienced costs in excess of the amount projected in the 2013 - 2014 Current Expense Budget for addressing the 2013 - 2014 winter storms; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Public Works Traffic Planning Program has experienced costs in excess of the amount projected in the 2013 - 2014 Current Expense Budget to cover distribution and power charges related to County street lights; now, therefore;

1	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE
2	COUNTY, MARYLAND, pursuant to the power and authority conferred upon it by Section 712
3	of the Baltimore County Charter, that the Current Expense Budget for the fiscal year ending June
4	30, 2014, be and is hereby amended by appropriating unreserved, undesignated General Fund
5	Surplus in the amount herein specified, to, to the following program:

6	001-070-7505	Storm Emergencies	\$11,450,000
7	001-070-7701	Traffic Planning	\$550,000

8 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, that this Act, having been passed by 9 the affirmative vote of five members of the County Council, shall take effect June 15, 2014.
