A BILL
ENTITLED

AN ACT concerning

The 2014-2015 Current Expense Budget and Capital Budget
Contribution to the Capital Budget
Enhanced Productivity Thru Technology

FOR the purpose of amending the 2014-2015 Current Expense Budget and Capital Budget, by appropriating monies derived from revenues received from anticipated sources but in excess of the budget estimates, through the General Fund to the Capital Improvement Fund.

WHEREAS, in accordance with Section 712 of the Baltimore County Charter, the County Council may make emergency appropriations from revenues received from anticipated sources but in excess of the budget estimates; and

WHEREAS, the requested improvement in security for the safety of school students is to be considered a public emergency affecting life, health or property; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Section 716 of the Baltimore County Charter, the County Council may, upon recommendation of the County Executive, amend the Capital Budget; now, therefore;

1 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE
2 COUNTY, MARYLAND, pursuant to the power and authority conferred upon it by Section 712
3 716 of the Baltimore County Charter, that the Current Expense Budget and the Capital Budget
4 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2015, be and is hereby amended by appropriating unreserved,
5 undesignated General Fund Surplus in the amount herein specified, to, to the following program:
