The meeting was called to order by Chairman Jones at 6:10 P.M. Due to continued COVID-19 concerns, in lieu of in-person appearances in the Council Chambers, the meeting was convened via Webex teleconference. В. APPROVAL OF JOURNAL

Upon motion by Councilman Quirk, seconded by Councilwoman Bevins, the reading of the Journal Entries for the meeting of November 1, 2021 was waived and accepted unanimously.

C. **ENROLLMENT OF BILLS**

The Chairman stated that the following Bills were passed by the County Council and signed by the County Executive. He certified and delivered to the Secretary, Bills 86-21, 87-21 and 88-21.

D. **INTRODUCTION OF BILLS**

Bill 98-21, entitled AN ORDINANCE concerning authorization of the issuance, sale and delivery by Baltimore County, Maryland (the "County") of its (i) general obligation consolidated public improvement bonds in the maximum aggregate principal amount of \$100,000,000, (ii) general obligation metropolitan district bonds in the maximum aggregate principal amount of \$250,000,000, (iii) general obligation bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance of such bonds in the maximum aggregate principal amount equal to the maximum aggregate principal amount of such bonds, provided that the aggregate principal amount of the bond anticipation notes issued and outstanding at any one time pursuant to the authority hereof,

together with any bond anticipation notes issued and outstanding pursuant to the authority of any other ordinance of the County heretofore enacted, shall not exceed \$350,000,000 and (iv) general obligation refunding bonds in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed 130% of the aggregate principal amount of the bonds authorized to be refunded; and the determination of various matters relating to the authorization, issuance, sale and delivery of such bonds and notes.

- <u>Bill 99-21</u>, entitled An Act for the purpose of amending the 2021-2022 Capital Budget, by appropriating to the Capital Budget Monies derived from federal and state funds and made available to the County from the State of Maryland.
- <u>Bill 100-21</u>, entitled An Act for the purpose of amending the 2021-2022 Current Expense Budget, by appropriating to the Gifts and Grants Special Revenue Fund monies derived from federal funds and made available to the County through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration.
- <u>Bill 101-21</u>, entitled An Act for the purpose of requiring the Design Review Panel to review development plans for proposed nonresidential developments located in certain areas of the Overlea-Rossville Commercial Revitalization District; and generally relating to the review of certain nonresidential development plans by the Design Review Panel.
- <u>Bill 102-21</u>, entitled An Act for the purpose of establishing a fair election fund; establishing a fair election fund commission; and generally relating to establishing a fair election fund.
- <u>Bill 103-21</u>, entitled An Act for the purpose of revising and reconstituting the councilmanic districts of Baltimore County in accordance with the latest census figures published as a result of the U.S. Census of 2020, as required by Section 207 of the Baltimore County Charter.
