AMENDMENT NO. 1

The following information is offered, as the result of correspondence received prior to February 21, 2025.

1. Question: Do these programs have a 'head of household' that keeps an eye on the house?

Answer: Level II Type M (Monitored) are frequently called sober homes or sober living.

They are alcohol and illicit substance-free recovery housing that utilize house rules and peer accountability to maintain safe and healthy living environments. Senior residents, appointed by the owner/operator to serve as the head of household, are typically called the House Manager. To serve higher needs/lower

recovery capital populations, such as transition aged youth (e.g., youth 16-25 years of age) with opioid use disorders, some Level II's provide recovery support

services and life skills development but at a lower intensity than Level III's.

2. Question: Is there an expected number of bedrooms as a bidder we are expected to have

available or houses?

Answer: As long as the houses have the proper certification and fit the needs of the

participant, there is no expected number of bedrooms.

3. Question: Do houses get filled at one time, or could there be a house with only one bedroom

occupied?

Answer: There is a requirement that the referred participants have an opportunity for social

connection to support recovery. There is no requirement based on how the

houses are filled.

4. Question: How many referrals does the County anticipate?

Answer: In fiscal year 2025, the County referred 61 participants to recovery housing, with

an average stay of 45 days.

5. All other terms and conditions remain the same.
