





Baltimore County Planning Board Requested Support for CCBC Funding

For FY2025:

- Appropriate state capital funds and student fees
- No additional County funding is sought

For November 2024 bond referendum (FY2026/2027 biennium):

- Appropriate \$21M of County funds, \$2.5M more than Target
- Fund Vital Student Services Center Renovation at CCBC Catonsville
- Fund Automotive Technology Building Renovation/Addition at CCBC Catonsville
- Fund \$5M of Deferred Maintenance; \$850K per campus each year



Context for Capital Investments at CCBC

- ❖ CCBC serves over 48,500 students in 1.8M gross square feet.
 - * 1.7M GSF in 50 buildings at 3 main campuses: Catonsville, Dundalk and Essex
 - 166,000 GSF in 4 extension centers: Owings Mills, Hunt Valley, Randallstown, and the Center for Transportation at TradePoint Atlantic
- CCBC leverages Baltimore County's investment.
 - Uses county funds to match or secure state, federal and philanthropic funds
 - Participates in capital funding by paying approximately \$16.3M of debt service annually and securing about \$750K a year in capital revenue from student fees
 - * CCBC builds cost-effective, energy efficient and sustainable facilities






Mezzanine spaces have been renovated to include two large dance studios suitable for CCBC's program that is accredited by National Association for Schools of Dance

Environmental Science Laboratory


An outdoor science laboratory was created in the storm water management area adjacent to the Wellness and Athletics Center building.




